ENTRY CLASSIFICATION FOR HOBBY EXHIBITS AND INDIVIDUAL ORCHID PLANTS FOR RIBBON AND AWARD JUDGING

NOTE 1:—IN ORDER FOR INDIVIDUAL PLANTS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR RIBBON AND NOS AWARD JUDGING, A GREEN TAG MUST BE COMPLETED. THE PLANT MUST HAVE OPEN FLOWERS. PLANTS WITH "JUST BUDS," EVEN THOUGH THERE IS EXPECTATION THAT THEY WILL OPEN THE NEXT DAY, CANNOT BE ENTERED. PLANTS THAT NORMALLY HAVE SPIKES OF SEVERAL FLOWERS SHOULD HAVE AT LEAST 5 TO 7 FLOWERS OPEN AT THE TIME OF REGISTRATION. ALL PLANTS ENTERED FOR JUDGING AND AWARDS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A COMPLETELY FILLED OUT GREEN TAG. (Anyone May Enter a Plant for Ribbon Judging, but All Awards Apply ONLY To NOS Hobby Growers Appropriately Registered)

NOTE 2:—FIRST BLOOM SEEDLINGS SHOULD BE EXHIBITED ON THE FIRST BLOOM SEEDLING TABLE. A GREEN TAG MUST BE COMPLETED AND THE PLANT REGISTERED AS FBS (FIRST BLOOM SEEDLING). NO ADDITIONAL ENTRY REQUIRED. A First Bloom Seedling is defined as a plant grown from seed that is in bloom for the first time ever. This does not mean the first time that the plant has bloomed for the current owner if it has bloomed before by a former owner or seller. There should be NO evidence of any previous bloom spikes. Mericlone plants, blooming for the first time are NOT SEEDLINGS. (See Glossary for definition of a Mericlone.)

NOTE 3:--NO AWARDS OR TROPHIES REQUIRE ADDITIONAL GREEN TAG TO BE COMPLETED, BUT PLANTS MUST BE REGISTERED IN THEIR APPROPRIATE CLASSES USING THE GREEN TAG SEE NOTE 1 ABOVE).
