- Secretary report: Cynthia Carlson presented the minutes of the 6/21/12 meeting; motion to approve by Dick Pippen; seconded by Kris Morton; passed unanimously.
 Cynthia will be absent from the August board meeting; Kris will take minutes.
- Congratulations to Norm and Nancy for their mention in AOS magazine.
- Treasurer's report: Bill submitted a report by email.
- Norm Dolder reported that the speaker for next month is Joe Hayden. He will speak on phaleanopsis and bring plants. Yolanda of Questo Orchids will speak in September.

- Kit Kitchen Maran, President, called the meeting to order at 7 pm.
- Secretary report: Cynthia Carlson thanked Kris Morton and Patrece Remmel for taking minutes while she was absent. Cynthia presented the minutes. Motion by Dick Pippen to accept the minutes for the 5/17/2012 meeting as presented. Seconded by Ralph Brand, passed unanimously.
- Treasurer's report: final accounting for 2012 Orchid Show, showing profit of \$3,387.66. Storage unit is paid through May 2013. Balances in accounts \$14,792.05 in Vanguard and \$3,943.81. Overall budget shows a deficit of \$2,714.43 but we still have the November sale. No more big expenses and more money should be coming in. There was discussion of the photographer expense at the Show. Bill explained that the photographer is necessary to take quality photos for AOS purposes.
- Norm Dolder reported that the speaker for next month is Thomas Hecker on mounting orchids in trees and landscapes. Discussion of what Joe Hayden will talk about at the August meeting. He is a phaleanopsis expert. Norm will talk to him and they will work it out. Yolanda of Questo Orchids will speak in September. Sue Roehl asked for the speaker list to put on the website.
- Deborah Gallagher reported that she has researched buses and finds that the smaller buses would not work. The normal size bus costs \$1,000 to \$1,100, plus tip, accommodating up to 50 people. Costs include bus, tip, plants, and refreshments, about \$45 per person. Plan is for an October bus trip. Tentative date Oct 6th. Deborah will check the date and pass a sign up sheet. Motion by Dick Pippen to charge \$40 for members and \$45 for non-members, seconded Kris Morton. Passed unanimously.
- Nanette Boerner reported total members at 238.
- Kris Morton reported that she is listing cookie bakers in the newsletter and has the list going forward. Kris appreciates the articles she is getting. Wants some on Redlands.
- Dick Pippen reported that Jim Roberts has already sent in vendor application and fee.
 Ofe will also return. Fuchs may participate. Nothing else new on the show. Scholarship interns will be here in July.
- Patrece Remmel passed around the old cards. The new cards will have printing on both sides but only the front will be coated. 1,000 cards is \$80; 2,500 is \$110; 5,000 cards is \$130. How many to order? Motion by Ralph Brand to buy 5000 cards, seconded by Dick Pippen. Passed unanimously.
- Ralph reported that he got an 81 point AM at the latest judging. He shared that the judging process is very interesting, in Davie, starts at 2pm. Bill Overton mentioned that

he goes to Tampa for judging every 4th Wed of the month (FL North Central region) and invited others to go with him.

- Marilyn Moser reported that she has a new grandson and she has been visiting him.
 Affiliate membership dues bill should be coming soon.
- Sue Roehl reported that she is updating website regularly. She is preparing an article on Cost Rican orchids and expects more articles from Dick.
- Kit reported that she will be sending some of Dick's articles to the Naples Daily News, to see if they will publish them.

Old Business:

- o Library inventory is getting back on track. Report to come next month.
- o Gazebo project: request for orchids went out. Facility is ready. Ted will check out and start preparing the ground and hanging orchids. Ted is still asking for orchids from the members. Nancy suggested that he try to get donations from vendors. Kit asked for before and after photos.
- O Summer movie: Black Orchid fundraiser in July? Discussion of feasibility ensued. Patrece suggested showing it on the bus trip.
- O Contest for 2013 40th Orchid Show medal and show logo: open to members, Nancy suggested using the winning orchid from the previous year. So moved by Patrece, seconded by Ralph Brand. Discussion of getting written permission to use the image of the prior year's winning orchid. Passed unanimously.

- O Donation of 1% for Orchid Conservation: discussion of the purpose of the donation; to show our commitment to orchid conservation; they will provide articles and information; board feels we are already doing orchid conservation; Patrece made a motion to contact OCC and let them know that we are already doing orchid conservation and promoting conservation; seconded by Dick Pippen. Passed unanimously.
- o Brochure/powerpoint for Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary: They have asked for someone to talk to their 5th graders; Dick and Kit are working to put something together.
- o Kit presented the conference proceedings for UF conference.
- Friends of Fakahatchee asked for support for their boardwalk expansion project. Kit will write a letter.
- O Deborah suggested that we pass around a suggestion box at the monthly meeting to see what the members want. Deborah will present at the next meeting. And a notice will be in the newsletter.
- Dick made a motion to adjourn. Seconded by Norm. Passed unanimously.

Amendments to the By Laws:

The Board of Directors of the Naples Orchid Society is recommending the following amendments to the By-Laws:

<u>Amendment 1</u>. To make the Webmaster and A.O.S. Representative elected officers of the Society. (See Exhibit A below)

The AOS Representative is the liaison between the American Orchid Society and the Naples Orchid Society, an affiliate organization. As such this position is an integral part of the Board of Directors and should have a voting voice.

The Webmaster is responsible for the Society's website, which is equivalent in significance as the Newsletter Editor, and therefore should have a voting voice.

<u>Amendment 2</u>. To make the necessary changes in the By Laws resulting from the approval of Amendment 1 above.

- a. To change the number of officers from eight to ten and the number of Directors from eleven to thirteen wherever listed in the By Laws (See Exhibit A below)
- b. To delete the following statement from Section 13 (p. 5), #1: The A.O.S.

 Representative shall be present at board meetings as liaison between the

 American Orchid Society and the Naples Orchid Society (because that person will now be an elected officer). (See Exhibit B below)
- c. To delete the following statement from Duties of the Officers, Section 7 (p 9), #1:

 He/she shall appoint . . . an A.O.S. representative (because that person will now be an elected officer). (See Exhibit C below)

Exhibit A (p. 9 of By Laws)

OFFICERS

<u>Section 1.</u> <u>Enumeration of Offices.</u> The officers of the corporation shall be a president, a first vice-president, a second vice-president, a secretary, a treasurer, a newsletter editor, a publicity director, a membership director, a webmaster and an A.O.S. representative. All <u>ten</u> officers are also members of the board of directors. Additional officers may be added by appropriate amendments to these bylaws.

(p. 2 of By Laws)

Section 3. Number and Election of Directors:

- (1) The board of directors shall consist of no less than <u>thirteen</u> individuals, <u>ten</u> of whom are officers, and three directors, who are not officers, who serve staggered terms.
- (2) The number of directors may be increased or decreased from time to time by the amendment of these by-laws.

(3) The <u>ten</u> officers elected for one (1) year terms in accordance with Article V, Sections 2 & 3 shall also serve as directors during said year.

(p. 11 of By Laws)

NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 2. Procedure. This committee shall draw up a slate of <u>ten</u> officers who will also be directors and one director who is not an officer to be presented to the membership at the October meeting. At the November annual meeting, all nominations from both the nomination committee and any from the floor shall be properly approved and the nominations will be closed after all nominations have been made. Following this, the election of the officers and director shall occur by ballot cast at the meeting, or by acclamation if there is only one candidate for a position.

Exhibit B (p. 5 of By Laws)


Section 13. Other Attendees.

(1) The A.O.S. Representative shall be present at board meetings as liaison between the American Orchid Society and the Naples Orchid Society. The Show Chairperson shall be present to report progress on the upcoming show and to receive approval of unusual show costs or changes from previous shows. For the two meetings prior to the Orchid Sale, the Sale Chairperson shall be invited to the Board Meeting to explain the procedures. These members come to board meeting for information purposes only and have no vote on board matters.

Exhibit C (p. 9 of By Laws)

Section 7. Duties. The duties of the officers are as follows

(1) President: The president shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors and all annual, regular, or special meetings; shall see that orders and resolutions of the board are carried out; shall co-sign all written instruments and promissory notes; shall perform all duties incident to the office of the president as may from time to time be assigned by the board of directors; and have general supervision over the affairs of the society and to see that the by-laws are enforced. He/she shall appoint all committee chairs, an A.O.S. representative, and an annual show chairperson. He/she along with the treasurer shall be the only officers empowered to sign checks.
